



TACTICAL EMERGENCY CASUALTY CARE (TECC)

For FIRE / EMS

A course designed to present a strong foundation of principals to delivering emergency medical care for patients in a tactical environment

Target Audience: BLS & ALS providers

Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) Courses are now being offered here in our Region! This is an 8-hour course divided into two separate parts. Part 1 is the didactic / lecture presentation and will be delivered in a virtual training session. Part 2 is the psychomotor portion of the course and will be an in person / hands-on training to put into practice what has been taught virtually.

Course Objectives:

- Examine and address the unique and challenging requirements of administering point of wounding medical care by Fire/Rescue/EMS personnel to patients during a high-threat incident
- Learn to distinguish between life-saving and secondary interventions, and when they should be applied based on the prevailing threat to responders and patients based on all three phases during integrated operations such as Rescue Task Force
- Proper application and interventions such as tourniquets, wound packing, pressure bandages, and other techniques to support tenants of damage control resuscitation.

Participants MUST attend both parts of this 8 hour course to receive CE / In Service credit.
