EMT-Intermediate to Paramedic Bridge Program June 13, 2014 – April 25, 2015

This course is intended to provide the education necessary for the currently certified Emergency Medical Technician - Intermediate (EMT-I) to become a Nationally Certified Paramedic (NRP). The EMT-I to Paramedic Program is designed to certify the technician to the highest level of pre-hospital advanced life support care available in Virginia. This program fulfills all the requirements of the 2010 National EMS Education Standards for Paramedic (www.ems.gov/educationstandards.htm). The EMT-I to Paramedic Program is designed to educate the technician in all areas of pre-hospital patient care. These areas include instruction in: pre-hospital environments, preparatory skills, airway management and ventilation, patient assessment, trauma care, medical patient management, obstetrical/gynecological conditions, pediatric patients, neonatal care, psychiatric and behavioral emergencies, special considerations, and assessment based management.
